Prefatory Note

PREFATORY NOTE.

This book is published by the request of the Nashville Preachers' Association. In our wide range of discussion the subject of Church Registers came up. All in use are imperfect and therefore unsatisfactory. A committee was appointed. Ample time was given them to examine and report. Men who have served on missions, circuits, stations, and districts were on this committee.

This Register is the result of their labors. The veterans of the Publishing House and the Officers of the General Conference hereabouts say that it meets the demand.

Afterward, the Committee on Publishing Interests of the General Conference of 1890, recommended it in the following language:

"They have carefully examined the Church Register referred to them and recommended by the Nashville Preachers' Association, and they respectfully recommend the adoption of the same by this General Conference, and that the Book Agent is hereby instructed to publish an edition of the same, and keep them in stock; and further, that this General Conference earnestly recommend this Register to our Churches, and that it be procured whenever the purchase of a new Church Register becomes necessary."

Explanations & Suggestions

EXPLANATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS.

- 1. The names should be recorded in chronological order.
- The beauty of the book will be enhanced by using a plain black ink in making all entries. Pencil marks mar the appearance of the register.
- The law requires that the first name should be written in full. To illustrate: write James E. Brown, not J. E. Brown.
 - 4. If a mistake should be made in an entry, it should be carefully erased.
- 5. Observe the following, when recording the names of members: use the third column under head of "To whom Married" only when a woman (whose name is already on the roll) marries, then insert in this column only the surname of the man to whom she is married. To illustrate: the name of Mary Jones appears on the register, she marries a Mr. Johnson; simply find her name on the roll and write "Johnson" opposite her name in the column under "To whom Married." This obviates the necessity of recording her name in a new place, which would derange the chronological accuracy of the record. Under the general heading, "When and How Received," write under the proper sub-heading only the date of reception. Thus: "10 Jan., '90," rather than "Jan. 10, '90," or "January 10, 1890." In the column, "By whom Received," write the name of the preacher who officiates at the reception, and not the name of the pastor unless he receives the member in person. Under the general heading, "When and How Removed," write under the proper sub-heading only the date of removal, as in reception. Thus: "15 Nov., '90."
- 6 On the last double page of the book provision is made for the "Annual Summary of Members. After the name of the pastor is written, then write in the next column headed. "Conference Year Ending," only the date of the close of the conference year. Thus: "10 Oct., '90" Then write in figures in the proper place as indicated in the headings the whole number of conversions, receptions or removals, during the conference year. In giving the totals include only the total number received and removed. In making up the net increase or decrease do not take the difference between the total number received and removed, but the difference between the total membership of the present year. In the column headed, "Present Number," write the present number of members in the Church.

Short History of the Boulevard Church

The purchase of the land and building for the Boulevard Mission Church can be found in the **Leon County, Florida, Deed Book OO, pages 134 and 135**. The deed is dated March 1, 1909 and states that Robert G. Gamble and his wife Frances E. Gamble of Haverford, Pennsylvania, for nine hundred dollars, is selling their property to the Trustees of the Boulevard Methodist Episcopal Church, South. The Trustees are named: O.C. VanBrunt, R.N. McKinnon, Geo. P. Banks, W.A. Zachary, and F.M. Floyd. The legal description for the property is described as lots three (3) and four (4) in the south half of the County Quarter of said City of Tallahassee.

Quoting from the TRINITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH: TALLAHASSEE'S
FIRST CHURCH 1824 – 1999
LINDA H. YATES, EDITOR
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"Missions were being established in two directions-southwest near the depot and east in the Magnolia Heights area. At the May 20, 1908 Quarterly Conference, John H. Humphress, William P. Byrd, P. T. Nicholson, D. D. Cureton, and the pastor, Ira S. Patterson, were elected trustees of the Magnolia Heights mission and were asked to serve as a building committee as well. At the same meeting, O. C. Van Brunt, W. A. Zachery, George P Banks, and F. M. Floyd were elected trustees for the Boulevard Street mission. T. N. Godbolt became the Sunday school superintendent. By the Fourth Quarterly Conference in December, the Boulevard Street Church had been organized with 75 members. At the same meeting, John Humphress was given a rising vote of thanks for donating lots upon which to build the Magnolia Heights mission. It was reported that material had been ordered and construction was under way. The January 1909 meeting of the Quarterly Conference heard reports that the Magnolia Heights building would be completed by spring and that \$250 would be needed for the completion, A committee was asked to report at the next Quarterly Conference on location of a lot suitable for the Boulevard Street Church.

A Short History

Meeting on March 3, 1909, the Quarterly Conference approved the purchase of a lot for \$1,000 to be borrowed at 8 per cent interest. The lot was located where the Civic Center now stands. It was also announced that the Epworth League would sponsor the Magnolia Heights mission. By spring, the Weekly True Democrat published an article about a building boom in Tallahassee that included erection of the South Boulevard Street Church "at a cost of about several thousand dollars." Reference was also made to a service led by the presiding elder in the Boulevard Street Church tent. Rev. J. E. Woodward, as pastoral assistant to Patterson, served the church.

In 1914, the pastor, T. J. Nixon, urged members of the Boulevard Street Church to transfer their membership to Trinity, as only one Methodist Church was needed in Tallahassee. In 1916, O. C. Van Brunt, G. W. Saxon and J. G. Collins were appointed to arrange for the sale of the Boulevard Street property. By the next year, they reported that the building was rented for \$20 a month. In 1920, the property was sold to Emmanuel Baptist Church, and the balance owed to the Board of Church Extension was paid in full." End quote from the Trinity publication.

The sale of the property was *not* to the Immanuel Baptist Church as stated above. Even though Immanuel Baptist Church did eventually own and occupy the same property, this start-up church (members from First Baptist Church) did not come into existence until 1935. Therefore, as found in **Leon County Deed Book 2**, **p 492**, the following passage is the introduction to the sale of the Boulevard property in 1920. The legal description for the property is described as lots three (3) and four (4) in the south half of the County Quarter of said City of Tallahassee.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 25th. day of September, A. D. 1920, between 0. C. VanBrunt, R. N. McKinnon, 0. C. Parker, T. N. Godbolt and A. H. Charleville, as Trustees of the Boulevard Methodist Episcopal Church South, of Tallahassee, Florida, of the County of Leon in the State of Florida, parties of the first part, and The Pilgrim Congregational Church, of Tallahassee, Florida, in the County of Leon in the State of Florida, party of the second part.

E. Lynn McLarty, Tallahassee, Florida, has written a more complete history of the Boulevard Church and the property where it was located.

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Vision

In the early 1990's and in the midst of my genealogical travels to many libraries throughout Florida, Georgia, and Alabama (much, much before the availability of information on family history websites), and finding indexed books on a community church's history, the thought occurred to me to pursue the possibility of organizing Trinity's old records in a format readily accessible to other family history enthusiasts.

A long-time member of Trinity, a founding member of the Tallahassee Genealogical Society, and a resource person in my early years of genealogical research, Nellie Bird Mims supported me wholeheartedly on my idea for Trinity's records. With Nellie's encouragement I made mention of my broad plan to the co-chairpersons of Trinity's Church History Committee Vernon and Jamie Parramore.

On a Friday morning within the next few weeks I experienced an "awakening" when they introduced me to the membership books. I was holding in my lap for the very first time these very old church records. I marveled at how the history of Trinity, Tallahassee's first religious organization, paralleled our City of Tallahassee's history.

Furthermore, I could readily see that the varied information on each Trinity individual would be a treasure to any genealogist. There were names, baptism dates, marriage dates, death dates, and in some later books the place of residence of the family. Some membership books named an individual's former church before coming to Trinity as well as the name of the new church and city when someone moved their membership from Trinity.

After this Friday morning experience my mind began to visualize the creation in a computer program a digital replication of this most-important resource of Trinity's past. I was impressed how all the entries in the membership books followed the same format—rows and columns. These membership books were stock items purchased with the sole intend for churches to record their membership rolls.

My immediate endeavor was to search the available computer software which would allow a spreadsheet design, a single entry of data, and allow an easy manipulation of this data to accommodate future changes in formatting. Within the Microsoft product Excel I found my answer for the choice for the software. During this time of my making these logistical decisions, the Parramores were gaining the support for my work from the Preservation of Church History Committee and from the Senior Minister David Hortin. The year was about 1995.

Vision

The first item to undertake was to photocopy the contents of Book 1. I spent many Friday mornings in the Church office (under the tutelage of the staff secretaries showing me the intricacies of their sophisticated photocopier) meticulously copying the pages from Book 1. One must remember the delicacy of handling this book and the care that had to be taken to insure the book's integrity while turning it upside down for the photocopying process. All the pages were tattered, some to the point of being brittle. The pages of photocopied material were then hole-punched and bound.

Photocopying Book 1 solved three issues:

- 1) it gave me a copy of the book at home to make the entries onto the computer, on my time without having to be at the Church;
- 2) it allowed for minimum handling of the book during the time of data entry; and,
- 3) it gave the Church another copy of this most-important treasure in case of its subsequently being misplaced or destroyed.

For the next year or so the Excel file slowly paralleled Book 1. What pride to see this reality of my original vision! Once the contents of Book 1 had been entered into the realm of the "digital age", Book 2 was approached in the same manner as described for Book 1. Book 3, Book 4, and all the other membership books were photocopied for my use at the appropriate time.

In about 2001 Linda Yates became chairperson of the Preservation of Church History Committee. She and her husband Bob Yates constantly were stimuli for me to continue this project. All this time it was my intention to have the books put into print for dissemination to libraries, to state archives, and into private homes. At that time I envisioned that each book, or a compilation of the entire array of books, was to be a purchasable item, maybe a money making project for the youth or some other Trinity related group.

Only with the proliferation of the world-wide web and its ability to distribute information exponentially beyond the walls of a public library did I start thinking of preparing my work for a Trinity website or for a website under the auspices of the Tallahassee Genealogical Society. The search for a person with computer software knowledge of how to take my project and adapt it to the Internet was a slow process. Internet protocol constantly changed, and expanded in dynamics and use. With the hope that this unique individual was "just around the corner" I began to make final scrutiny of my entries to prepare the database of Book 1.

What I needed was a partner who could be generous with her time to work closely with me to edit my work in regards to spelling, formatting, and deciphering handwritten entries.

In 2010 Judy Tait Levy offered to sit with me one afternoon and let me show her my work in transcribing Trinity's membership records, in particular Book 1. As a Tallahassee native she immediately became interested in the names, the dates, and the association of Trinity's history with present-day Tallahassee. From that date on she has been invaluable to this project; constantly revising, constantly enhancing our project.

Vision

It was in the summer of 2012 that Judy and I were introduced to the third member of our team, that long-sought person with the knowledge and the dedication to work alongside us to make Book 1 an Internet reality. Colleen McConnell has been, without question, the answer to my prayer for this project to go from a static computer database to our dream of Trinity's membership records available to the world.

The Rev. Wayne Curry came to Trinity as the senior minister in the summer of 2008. It was through his direction and commitment to the long-sought establishment of a Church Heritage Room did Trinity come into its prominence of having our valued historical records available for use by our congregation and the public. Linda and Bob Yates planned the room and with the help of other committee members and church staff completed it for an open house on Trinity's 185th anniversary in September 2009.

Preserving and sharing Trinity's treasured past in the Heritage Room and making portions of our heritage accessible through the Internet is finally coming to fruition!
